There are many different types of furniture strippers to choose from, and it is important to choose the right one for the job. Whether it is liquid or gel-like, strippers dissolve layers of paint, varnish, enamel and other coatings and penetrate intricate carvings and decorative trim making them easy to lift with a scraper or brush.

For a low odour option that is safe for use indoors where there is little ventilation, try Heirloom™ Pure.

Tools needed:

Disposable brush
Paint scraper
Steel wool
Lint-free cloth
Eye protection
Chemical-resistant gloves
Newspaper or drop-cloth

Materials needed:

Heirloom™ Furniture Stripper
Paint thinner



A Step-by-Step Guide to Using Heirloom™ Furniture Strippers

Step 1



Read the product label before using. Apply a generous coating to the surface of your treasured item. Do not brush out. Let stand for 10 to 20 minutes or until paint has softened sufficiently.

Step 2



Remove the softened layers with a scraper or steel wool or by rubbing the surface with sawdust.

Step 3



Clean the area with a lint-free cloth dampened with stripper to remove all traces of loosened paint.

Step 4



To ensure a clean surface, wipe with another cloth dampened with paint thinner.

Using Furniture Strippers

To remove paint from porous surfaces, such as brick and concrete, instead of using a scraper, use a stiff scrubbing brush to get softened paint out of crevices.

Wait 24 hours and then apply a new finish. No other treatment is necessary.

Heirloom™ Furniture Strippers are effective and safe for use on antiques or fine wood, plaster, glass, fiberglass, masonry, leather, natural fibre fabrics, carpets and metal.

It will not harm veneer or raise the grain on wood, however do not expose the product to synthetic fabrics, plastic vinyl, rubber or asphalt.

Caution: Wear heavy-duty rubber gloves and safety goggles to protect your hands and eyes and work in a well-ventilated area (open a door or window and use a fan) to avoid inhaling vapours. If working in an enclosed area, wear an appropriate mask designed for organic vapours. Keep the container tightly closed when not in use.

Disposal: Save the remainder for future projects in the tightly sealed original container. The product will keep for at least two years when stored properly.

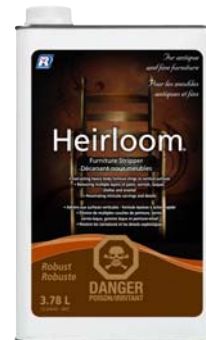
If you wish to dispose of the remainder of the product, contact your municipality for information about how to dispose of it safely.
